Premier Society at the Forefront of Broader Impact Initiatives

As the primary ambassadors to scientific disciplines, professional societies stand at the interface between the general public, trainees, educators, and practitioners. By supporting, disseminating, and developing structured programs, disciplinary societies are poised to be the most durable and sustainable vehicles of broader impact (BI) initiatives. The American Society for Microbiology (ASM) is the leading professional society to model BI sponsorship. ASM actively promotes BI activities through the following avenues: (1) ASM supports individual and collaborative BI efforts of its members through fellowships, professional development, and k-12 and public outreach, (2) ASM manages diverse networks and communities that encourage recruitment and collaborations through its members, minority initiatives, and undergraduate-focused conferences, and (3) ASM capitalizes on the use of multimedia and social events to communicate science to a broader audience. Most recently, ASM has implemented the Leaders inspiring Networks and Knowledge (LiNK) Program, an initiative to advance investigator-educator collaborations, interdisciplinary research and broaden participation in STEM fields. By aligning our efforts with the needs of various stakeholders, ASM has created successful programs to broaden participation and increase public engagement in the STEM fields.




Figure 1. Broader Impacts at ASM


